My Experience at Liu Po Shan Memorial College

I still remember the first day I came here. Everyone was so interested in me and my country, and asked me to take pictures and have lunch together. I felt welcome and was ready to start my great experience in my new school. I'm the first exchange student at Liu Po Shan Memorial College. For this reason, the beginning was exciting yet a bit complicated because no one had got used to this new experience. But step by step, everyone started to consider me as a part of this amazing school. Being an exchange student means having the courage to put yourself in front of everybody and let them know you for who you are and let them teach you about their country by living as a native rather than as a guest. Only in this way you'll be given the chance to integrate yourself into a new society. I wanted to explore, to taste everything that was new to me, to learn as much as I could, to know more about your traditions and your lifestyle; I wanted to meet new people and make friends, and compare their ways of thinking or behaviour with mine in my home town. This school has been the perfect place where I could do all of these things. It's here where I met excellent teachers and new friends. Some of them became really important to me. Together, we found a new way of looking at things we often considered commonplace or took for granted. They helped me learn Cantonese and motivated me not to be afraid to try and not to give up even when I had to tackle some difficulties. They explained everything to me every time I couldn't understand. I truly appreciated that.

I found Hong Kong's education system really competitive, but I consider it one of the

best in the world because schools here are not just places in which students are given lessons and examinations, but also a place in which students can grow up with others and learn how to improve their knowledge and themselves. Liu Po Shan inspires and motivates every student to get better and have greater confidence in their own abilities. I was surprised when I saw how much effort teachers put into their work, how many hours they spend with their students, giving them extra lessons and correcting their homework just to make sure that every student is well-prepared to achieve their goals. I took part in many extra-curricular activities during this year. I have to give a special thanks to the social worker for inviting me to participate in several programs. I really enjoyed every moment with all of those who joined the World Citizens Program, and am grateful for all the support I got from them. Thank you for the fantastic atmosphere that is always present in this school and for the good relationship that every teacher built with me. You haven't been just teachers for me, but also people to talk with if I needed to.

Time flies and it's incredible how much more I feel a part of this place now. A tearful goodbye came all too quickly, even though it's been just one year, it will bring rewards lasting a lifetime.

I feel a completely new person now, a better person with a more tolerant and open-minded vision of the whole world and this has been possible mostly thanks to you.
